

2022 Wall of Distinction Honoree - Keith E. Groller



The most heartwarming comment that I have ever heard about our next 2022 honoree came from a fellow Husky who said that she was very thankful to have had the opportunity to tell his parents that they did a fine job raising such a wonderful son. That son, a distinguished alumnus from the Class of 1979, needs no introduction to anyone who has picked up the Morning Call Sports Section in the past four decades or scrolled on-line to check out his weekly column. Of course, I am referring to the one-and-only Keith Groller.

Only a few months after he graduated from Dieruff, Keith covered his very first high school football game on Octo-

ber 19, 1979. He later joined the Morning Call staff as a full-time reporter in 1982 and never looked back. Today, as the Morning Call's Senior Sportswriter, Keith covers high school football, basketball, softball, and Lehigh University football. He also reports on state championship games from Hershey and promotes the summertime Lehigh Valley Sports Fest and Stellar "Catch a Rising Star" basketball showcases for high school athletes.

Although he followed in the footsteps of the legendary sportswriter John Kunda, Keith successfully forged his own path as he went on to become the Morning Call's top columnist as well as a popu-



lar host on his own television and radio programs. During his 40-year career, he has also covered Super Bowls, the World Series, the Philadelphia 76ers and Eagles, the Indianapolis 500, and NASCAR races from the Pocono Raceway.



He has been the recipient of numerous community service awards and has been inducted into seven Halls of Fame. He was also saluted by the Morning Call in 1999 with the Publisher's Excellence Award as the newspaper's top employee.



Loyal readers would undeniably agree that Keith's outstanding character shines with his sincere kindness and humility which are matched only by his life-long devotion to the coverage of high school sports. This is evident when he reminds students to "follow their passion" and in his Twitter feeds which always include post-game interviews with players whose talents he highlights. He truly cares about the kids and wants to support them in the best way possible. Keith even hosts his annual "Kegger Awards" – his initials are K.E.G. - to salute the unsung heroes of area high school basketball.

Yes, Rocky and Nancy Groller did, indeed, raise a fine son whose name has become synonymous with Lehigh Valley sports. And we are so grateful that they raised him

2022 Wall of Distinction Honoree - Tony Hanna

The 1.5 million people who visit the SteelStacks campus each year can thank our next Wall of Distinction honoree who led the revitalization efforts of the former Bethlehem Steel site on the Christmas City's South Side. The Louis E. Dieruff High School Alumni Association is proud to salute Tony Hanna, Class of 1969, who, as the Executive Director of the Redevelopment Authority of the City of Bethlehem, was the driving force behind the award-winning urban renewal project which transformed the nation's largest "brown field" site into a cultural arts and entertainment mecca.



Raised in the Sixth Ward, Tony worked hard to prepare himself for the academic challenges of a college education. He continued his studies at Lehigh University from which he graduated cum laude in 1973 with a degree in Engineering and Environmental Science. Although he was offered many employment opportunities, he decided to remain in his hometown to advance the city in which he grew up. During his ten years with the City of Allentown, he served as the Executive Vice-President of the Allentown Economic Development Corporation, the Assistant Director of City Planning, and Finance Director for the Allentown Redevelopment Authority.

Tony then spent 15 years in the private sector in real estate development and property management. As President of Butz Development, Inc., his primary focus was on medical office development in the Lehigh Valley and Philadelphia areas.

With a desire to return to public service, Tony took his planning and development skills eastward when new opportunities were presented to him with the City of Bethlehem. Prior to stepping up to his leadership role with the Redevelopment Authority, he served as the Director of the Department of Community and Economic Development. A most significant accomplishment was crowned in 2017 when his SteelStacks



and Hoover-Mason Trestle projects were honored with the nationally-acclaimed Rudy Bruner Foundation Gold Award for Urban Excellence.



A recipient of numerous awards for community and economic development, this '69 Husky who had spent two summers as a steel worker while a student at Lehigh, shared these thoughts about his long and successful career:

"Being able to help Bethlehem rebuild itself after the devastating loss of Bethlehem Steel was both a challenge and a source of great pride and professional achievement. My almost 25 years in Bethlehem allowed me to do something not many people are able to do, help a City reinvent and rebuild itself - and we did.

Long after I'm gone, my work will live on. Whether it's part of the redevelopment of the former Bethlehem Steel site, or a medical building on one of the campuses of Lehigh Valley Health Network, it is an awesome feeling.

Nothing makes me happier than to hear people talk about how much they enjoy visiting Bethlehem, whether it's Main Street on the North Side or SteelStacks or the Casino on the South Side. Even a visit to a doctor's office is a source of great pride and accomplishment, particularly if I developed the building that the doctor is practicing in."



Yes, Tony's work will surely live on. It will live on when anyone looks up at the towering signature blast furnaces that seem to guard and preserve the history of the Steel's flagship mill. It will live on when folks enjoy a guided tour along the easily-accessible trestle pedestrian walkway or stroll along the cobblestone streets in Historic Bethlehem.

And his legacy to his community and to his alma mater will forever be enshrined on the Louis E. Dieruff High School Alumni Wall of Distinction.

As Tony remarked, "I am proud to be an Allentonian and even prouder to be a Dieruff Husky."







Huskies In The News....

The front page of the August 17, 2022 edition of The Morning Call featured the photo below along with the headline, "The 'Semper Fi guy' remains true to form". The article describes how Staff Sgt. Tim Chambers, better known as the "Saluting Marine" visited Marine veteran Bob Bulldog Hontz and members of the Dieruff High School class of 1966 and 1977 at their monthly breakfast meeting at the City View Diner in Allentown.

Chambers earned his nickname on Memorial Day about two decades ago at a Rolling Thunder demonstration near the Pentagon. On that day, he stepped off the curb and began saluting the passing motorcycle parade of veterans riding by in honor of the nation's MIA's and POW's. He has continued that profound action annually, often holding his salute for hours while in dress uniform.

Following breakfast, Chambers and several of the Dieruff group went to VFW Post 7293 in Whitehall for a tour of the

facility. Staff Sgt. Tim Chamber expressed his pleasure with the visit, and likened it to his salute in D.C. He said, "I get to jump off a curb in a diner in Allentown. Pennsylvania, and reach people before they pass away, and show that they're appreciated."
