Wall of Distinction – 2019 Inductees

Part 1 of a 3 Part Retrospective Joanne Ogrydziak '76



To celebrate our school's 60th year, the Alumni Wall of Distinction initiative was eagerly launched at the start of 2019 to recognize notable Dieruff graduates. Our first two alumni who were honored at the June 20th Inaugural Dedication were Richard "Rick" Braun '73 and Joseph "Joe" Hanna '74.

Often referred to as the "Godfather to Rick's get-up-and-dance rendiof Smooth Jazz," Rick Braun's career has spanned decades and has produced more than twenty #1 hits. An acclaimed chart-topping musician and composer, his talented arrangements and Sinatra -like voice can be heard on radio networks and soundtracks across the globe. On a local TV station. his fluid instrumental tunes welcome morning viewers as the Lehigh Valley weather forecast scrolls across the screen.

The second-youngest of six children, Rick grew up in center city Allentown near Sixth and Tilghman Streets. His hardworking parents nurtured a love for music which filled their home every day. As a young boy, Rick knew that he wanted to become a trumpeter when his mother took him to see his idol, Herb Alpert, at the Allentown Fair back in 1966. The rest, as we say, is Husky History.

A world-renowned performer, Rick Braun has never forgotten his humble Allentown roots. In June. he traveled with his son all the way from California to 815 North Irving Street to receive his Distinguished Alumni award, heartwarmingly embracing his high school music teacher upon entering the audi-

torium which today bears Mr. Carpenter's name. Fellow Huskies who have attended his local concerts often hear Rick play impromptu versions of the **Dieruff Fight Song with his** younger brother Russ '77 jumping in on the trombone.

So, the next time you treat yourself tion of the Hugh Masekela classic hit, "Grazing in the Grass," picture a voung teenager hearing it for the first time while walking alongside the Stevens School in the Summer of 1969. That was Rick. Give a listen (below) and enjoy!

Graduating one year later was our second honored alumnus, Lehigh County Sheriff Joseph Hanna, a proud member of the Class of 1974. A recipient of multiple awards for professional excellence in law enforcement. Joe is a selfproclaimed Sixth Warder and East Sider who demonstrated an ethic of hard work and determination at an early age.

When he served his fellow Huskies as Dieruff Student Council President for the 1973-1974 academic year, I was a young tenth-grader who was just learning her way around the halls of Husky High. My involvement in LED Student Council activities gave me the opportunity to meet Joe, and I was particularly impressed with

the maturity and gualities of leadership with which he carried out his responsibilities. It was clear that, even as a high school student, Joe stood out among his peers.

A public servant for forty years, Joe's storied career has taken him from patrolling the streets of Allentown to executing his duties in the office of Lehigh County Sheriff. He has been featured as a technical advisor on ABC News, 20/20. Prime Time. Court TV and on Forensic Files. An active board member of numerous local organizations, Joe also provides a spirit of volunteerism which continues to benefit the community in which he was raised.

Another interesting note about Joe is his family connection to Dieruff's rich sports history. His wife Randy, an alumna from the Class of 1976, is the daughter of Husky Basketball icon Richard "Dick" Schmidt after whom the East Side Gym is named.

Thank you, John Hughes. You were the right person at the right time.




Got a new dark blue collar this summer. Shows off my red highlights. Aunt Robin ordered me a blue leash
