# Arlotto Campaign: Put Your Name on the Donor Board



# FLASHBACK: Roy Rules at Husky High


Back in the late 1950's, when Roy Arlotto was an undergraduate at Lehigh University, he faithfully carried a slide rule on his left hip. That was one sure way anybody on campus could identify those engineers and science guys, as opposed to the arts and business majors. In addition, those students of technical persuasion always carried a plastic pocket protector in their shirt pocket, filled with four or five pens. If they wore eye glasses, inevitably they would be those large, black-framed spectacles.

With a wry smile on his face, that is just the way Roy would describe himself. He was never reluctant to add the word "nerd" to his self description.

I strongly believe that is exactly what made Roy Arlotto so popular at Husky High. He was absolutely brilliant, yet so down to earth, with a wonderful sense of humor. He would readily make himself the brunt of the joke. He came to Dieruff as a student teacher in chemistry in 1961, and then secured a permanent position. That was a time before the introduction of the electronic calculator, so the slide rule was the "tool of the trade". The kids loved him. For many, Mr. "A" inspired them to pursue a career in science. For those who found chemistry difficult, he made it fun.

Roy used a 10-foot slide rule as a humorous prop. Karen Hirst, Dieruff Class of 1969, writes, "I can still see Mr. Arlotto behind that huge slide rule..." He challenged all of his students to learn how to use it. Karen kiddingly boasts, "I was the only girl in the class to use one. Of course, I've never used it again in my life, but it was fun then."

If you're wondering whatever happened to Roy's slide rule, it hangs in Cathy Piston's math classroom. We're not sure if she's ever challenged anyone to learn how to use it.


