

2022 Wall of Distinction Honoree - David E. Fritchey, Esq.

The introduction of our second distinguished alumnus for 2022 takes us to the scenic countryside of Bucks County where we meet a retired federal prosecutor for the United States Department of Justice. The Louis E. Dieruff High School Alumni Association is proud to salute Allentown native David E. Fritchey, Esq., an award-winning attorney from the Class of 1965.

As a young boy growing up on North Fourth Street in center-city, David knew as early as fourth grade that he wanted to become a lawyer. By the time he entered Dieruff in 1962, his keen scholarly intellect caught the attention of his favorite English teacher, Miss (Sandra)



Urban. Today, Miss Urban - who later became Mrs. Peter Carpenter — warmly recalls that, although David was a stand-out student who excelled in science and mathematics, she was particularly impressed with his extraordinary creative writing and critical thinking skills. As Mrs. Carpenter recently remarked about her former pupil, "David was a 'dream' student who would have excelled in any career."

Other teachers at Dieruff who also recognized David's acumen and who played key roles in setting the course for his future in the field of law were Mr. (Paul) Esser and Mr. (Russell) Bear. They helped him to develop his gifted public speaking skills which later supported his success in the courtroom.

When recently asked about his days as a Husky, David shared his insights with these thought-provoking, prophetic words:

"The early 60s were a time of challenge. America was deep into the Cold War and the Space Race was moving at a furious clip. President Kennedy told us that the torch had been passed to a new generation of Americans and challenged us to rise to national service. DHS operated in the spirit of the times. The culture of our school promoted a self-confident optimism and a determined "can do" attitude. We expected to face challenges, and we welcomed them. In sports, we weren't the biggest team or the largest school, but we went toe-to-toe with the best competition in the state and held our own. I'll always remember the Morning Call's legendary sports writer John Kunda writing about Dieruff teams: "they're small, but they're tough." In academics it was the same way. Our teachers encouraged us to advance as far and as quickly in every subject as we could. (Continued on Page 7)

2022 Wall of Distinction Honoree - David E. Fritchey, Esq.

I remember English class with Ms. Urban (later Mrs. Carpenter), where we were required to write a theme every week. I remember Mr. Arlotto teaching an Advanced Chemistry class for four of us and Joe Romatowski winning the Lehigh Valley Science Fair. I remember Mr. Esser's World Affairs class, where we each received the daily edition of the New York Times and reported each day in class on current world events. I had the good fortune to be in honors and advanced placement classes with two, four and five students — classes DHS created with the intention of helping individual students push their limits to be the best they could be. When we graduated in June 1965, we knew we were entering a future filled with responsibility, challenge and uncertainty, and we entered it with the inspired confidence that we would be equal to the task."

After graduating from Muhlenberg College in 1969, David entered the highly selective Cornell Law School. Following a ten-year period serving as an assistance district attorney in two counties, he became a federal prosecutor in 1983. That led to his post as chief of the Organized Crime Strike Force at the United States Attorney's Office in

Philadelphia from which he spent 32 years prosecuting more than 100 members of the Philadelphia – Atlantic City notorious crime families. Most notable were the high-profile cases involving ruthless kingpins Nicodemo "Little Nicky" Scarfo and Joseph "Skinny Joey" Merlino. Recognized for his role in the trial litigation which led to the 1989 first-degree murder conviction of crime boss Nicky Scarfo, David received the coveted John Marshall Award which is the highest honor given to an attorney by the United States Department of Justice.



Although he is now retired, David is still quoted in news articles, television clips, books, and documentaries as the media continue to seek his commentaries on mob matters. He also serves his local community as a member of the Board of Supervisors for the Township of Lower Makefield.

The Louis E. Dieruff Alumni Association is very proud to call David E. Fritchey, our acclaimed crime fighter from the Class of 1965, one of its own and is most honored to fittingly add his name to our esteemed Alumni Wall of Distinction. His rewarding career in law proved that he took on the many challenges set before him and that he was surely "equal to the task."


Huskies In The News....
