Wall of Distinction Honoree: Matthew B. James '94

We continue our salute to our military's finest as we honor the second Wall of Distinction inductee for 2021. The Louis E. Dieruff High School Alumni Association is proud to introduce the youngest alumnus to be selected for this highly-esteemed award, Lieutenant Colonel Matthew B. James, USAF, from the Class of 1994.

Instructed by Master Sergeant Willard Jones (another Wall of Distinction honoree), Matthew trained as a cadet in Dieruff's nationally-acclaimed AFJROTC program. A scholar-athlete who was a member of the Dieruff swim team, he and a fellow classmate were then congressionally-selected to attend the United States Air Force Academy. It is interesting to note that 1994 was the only year that two Dieruff cadets from the same graduating class were chosen to attend the prestigious Air Force Academy.



Today Matthew serves as the Deputy Commander of the 3rd Operations Group at the Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson in Alaska. This group provides premier combatready aerospace forces to defend and protect USA interests globally. In addition, it trains and mobilizes squadrons to sustain air dominance and global mobility. Matthew has also served as the Chief of Plans for the United States Air Force Central Command and provided command over the Northeast on September 11, 2001, as part of the E-3 Sentry AWACS (Airborne Warning and Control System).

A Master Navigator and the recipient of numerous awards and decorations from the United States Air Force, this '94 Husky enjoys the Alaskan outdoors with his wife and children. 
Shortly thereafter, Toni


The 1971 Yearbook even chronicles the prank, complete with pictures of the purloined prize, as well as images of those renegade robbers.

Hi Everyone,

As a rescue I want to do as much as possible to help out less fortunate critters. There are so many sad cases. Want to share a story with you about the salvation of a young, red husky named Macaroni aka "Mack".

Mack had a horrible start. At seven weeks old he was thrown away. Put into a tiny cat carrier, the carrier was then tossed on a rural Mississippi road. Thankfully, a motorist saw it, thought something was wrong and stopped. Had this not happened the poor pup would have died of dehydration and excessive heat. How anyone could do such a horrible thing is beyond belief.

Lucky for Mack, he was transferred to The Three Husketeers, a husky rescue in Emmaus. Three Husketeers was founded in June 2018 by Toni Daniels. Over the years they have saved and homed 146 dogs, huskies and husky mixes. The new dogs are put with Toni's dogs and the older dogs aid in training and socialization. Huskies are pack animals and so it really works. If you want, check them out at Facebook. Like all rescues, huge vet bills, so any donation is welcomed.
