
Nominations for the Class of 2021 Alumni Wall of Distinction are being accepted now through February 28, 2021. The nomination form, along with selection criteria

# "Remote Learning" with Dr. Jennifer Dodd

There is no hiding her emotions! Dr. Jennifer Dodd, Director of the Dieruff Choir, would much rather be showcasing her group's talents at the Winter Concert, or at the various holiday venues throughout the Lehigh Valley. At the very least, she would like to be sharing her skills and vast knowledge with her students... face to face!



With the high school shuttered until February 1st (at least), those

rewarding opportunities have vanished like the ghost of Christmas Past. For the Dieruff students, "remote learning" has become the operative phrase. Many of them have adapted well. Others have resisted. Still others have totally rejected the approach.

For the teachers, the transition has been equally challenging. Just imagine teaching something as demanding as "Choir". The topic requires two-way communication, as well as group participation. The computer-based learning model makes that difficult at best.

Dr. Dodd conducts her classes from her home office in Coopersburg, PA, where she is surrounded by an electronic keyboard and multiple computers. She has honed her skills to multitask, juggling her ability to sing beautifully in soprano, second soprano, alto, tenor, and base, as well as to deftly play musical keyboard with her right hand.... then grab her mouse and manipulate her computer screen between sheet music and students, while making appropriate mute and un-mute decisions. With each of her students online from their respective homes (or the doctor's office or in their parents' car driving to North Carolina), Dr. Dodd orchestrates her lesson and makes a connection.

What is dramatically evident is the fact that Dr. Jennifer Dodd loves her music, and she adores her students...and they love her back. Even though "remote learning" means she is linked with her students via the frigidity of technology, her warmth and genuine caring flow through successfully. And those identical emotions are coming back at her. Dr. Dodd is a treasure, indeed!







#### Cranberry/Pumpkin Drops

2 cups whole wheat flour, 1 cup oatmeal, 1 cup raw cranberries, 1 can pumpkin 15 or 16 oz., 1 1/2 cup stock, chicken, beef, or veggie Mix all ingredients together. Using a cookie scoop or heaping teaspoon drop dough onto parchment covered cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for an hour. Turn off oven but the let the cookies stay in until oven is completely cool. You can loose the cookies before returning them to the cooling oven. Cranberries pop and are a bit sticky. You can also use a silicon baking sheet. No preservatives so put them into the freezer. Enjoy!
