
FLASHBACK: "Husky Spirit" Flag Boasts Space Odyssey

We're all guilty of it! How often have we passed by something of significance without a second glance, unaware of its importance?!

Case in point: there is a large, glass enclosed, gold-trimmed blue and gray banner that has been on display in the Dieruff High School main lobby for nearly two decades. Bearing proudly the high school logo, this coveted "Husky Spirit" flag is rarely (or never) noticed.

This banner had been carried into space aboard the Shuttle Columbia, and flew just shy of four million miles on a 12-day mission to update the Hubble Space Telescope!





Mark T. Lipsky, Dieruff Class of 1989, had been an ROTC cadet, and had dreamed of someday working for NASA. Mark went on to Penn State University where he earned his B.S. and masters degrees in engineering. In 1999, Mark landed a choice position at the Johnson Space Center in Houston, where he was the lead robotic designer for the STS-109 Columbia.

Astronaut Nancy Currie, veteran of three previous Space Shuttle Missions, was assigned to fly her fourth mission on STS-109 (March 1-12, 2002). On that flight, her primary role was to operate the Shuttle's 50-foot robotic arm to retrieve and deploy the telescope, following planned upgrades and repairs.

Lipsky had the responsibility (and honor) of coaching Currie on the use of the robotic arm. She thoughtfully asked Mark if there were anything he would like to have her take into space. That prized Dieruff banner was chosen. (*Continued on next page*)

In early May 2002, with the mission successfully complete, Astronaut Currie met with Mark to deliver that Husky flag that had been 360 miles above Earth. The venue for the presentation was none other than Dieruff High School.

The Morning Call account of the event read, "Dieruff turned out in force for its native son. Veterans from the American Legion, Marines in dress blues, and former teachers came to honor Lipsky. Even the Husky mascot, Kiska, came wearing a patriotic neckerchief."

A new chapter in the Dieruff History Book had been written. That "Husky Spirit" flag was framed and hung in a prominent location in the school lobby.

And now that you know "the rest of the story", the next time you enter the lobby, pause and reflect on the significance of that prized piece of cloth. That banner has earned a most unique measure of respect. You might even stop a passerby and share with them this marvelous story.



The Huskies also welcomed Marlon (Jai-T) Randall as the new coach. He brings with him a winning

track record, and a determination to have a positive influence on the Dieruff culture.



Originally from Williamsburg, VA, Randall had a standout high school career in Virginia. He played college ball at Albright in Reading. He served as head basketball coach at Pottstown for three years, and then moved to an assistant coaching position at Reading High School. There, he helped the Red Knights win the PIAA Class 6A title, the first state crown in school history.

Coach Randall is convinced that he can help the Huskies believe in themselves. That sounds monumental, inasmuch as they are coming off a 9-13 season last year, and have gone 30-92 over the last 6 seasons. The haven't made the District 11 playoffs since 2008.

As this year's season began, Dieruff opened against Emmaus. They lost by five points. Several days later, they played the Green Hornets again, avenging the loss, and winning by five. The Dieruff Alumni Association presented Coach Randall with a framed photo collage commemorating his first victory as a Dieruff Coach.
