



How appropriate it is to feature a very special Husky Love Story in this, the "Valentines Day Issue" of our monthly bulletin.




"In the beginning" captures the essence of this charming tale. The doors of the new high school had opened in September 1959. For many of the faculty members, it was their first job out of school. Such was the case for Richard "Dick" King. He had just graduated from Muhlenberg College, and he came to Dieruff to teach Spanish. He

was also the assistant wrestling coach, under Larry Fornicola. Sharing that first day on the job was Rita Yost, the school's first athletic secretary, serving under Athletic Director Paul Esser.

Two years later, in October 1961, Dick and Rita had their first date. Their relationship blossomed, and they became engaged to be married.





During the summer of 1963, Dick was in San Juan studying for his masters degree at the University of Puerto Rico. He contacted Rita, and suggested she fly down to Puerto Rico to get married. Rita eagerly made the trip, and the wedding was on.

Rita reports that they were married by a friend's uncle, who was a judge. She wore a brown dress with orange flowers (attire not featured in Bride Magazine). In the haste of the travel arrangements, Rita had forgotten to bring the wedding band that matched her engagement ring, so the couple purchased a 39-cent ring at a local novelty store.


What a magical ride! Their marriage lasted over five decades, until Dick's passing in December 2013. Their union produced two children and five grandchildren. The tragic passing of Andrea Reish Forrest has been met with overwhelming expressions of sympathy from members of our Husky Nation.


As the talented and extremely popular art teacher at Dieruff, she touched the hearts of her adoring students, as well as fellow faculty members.



Her passion for choreography, and her sincere love of her kids will long be remembered. We add our sincere condolences to her family and friends.












