### President's Message: The Hall and The Wall

It is not surprising that some folks are confused. Dieruff High School features two separate tributes to alumni: the Athletic Hall of Fame and the Alumni Wall of Distinction. This issue of "Husky Connections" includes a pair of articles about those displays; however, it might be helpful for me to briefly outline the significance of each one.

The Athletic Hall of Fame was established years ago by the Dieruff Booster Club. Located on a wall in the athletic lobby adjacent to the gymnasium, the display boasts four rows of plaques that recognize highly esteemed Husky athletes Included on the wall are such notables as Andy Voit, Class of 1984, PA State Wrestling Champion; Rick Hollister, Class of 1962, Dieruff's first State Champion in any sport, Swimmer (whose record for the 50 yard freestyle still remains

on the Dieruff record board); and Andre Reed, Class of 1980, inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio.

Realizing that there are many alumni who have distinguished themselves in fields other than athletics, the Dieruff Alumni Association presented a proposal to the Principal to establish the **Alumni Wall of Distinction**. Gaining immediate approval, the wall adjacent to the Main Office was selected to host the display. Four years of inductees grace the wall, and include the likes of Rick Braun, Class of 1973, internationally known smooth jazz trumpeter; Navy Rear Admiral Thomas Henderschedt, Class of 1988; and Tony Hanna, Class of 1969, who spearheaded the drive to establish the Steel Stacks entertainment venue in Bethlehem, PA.






#### Trio Added to Athletic Wall of Fame

The induction ceremony on December 17th was quite dramatic. The gymnasium bleachers were packed with spectators for the boys and girls basketball double-header between the Huskies and Canaries. Between the two games, Principal Michael Makhoul, the three inductees, and their respective introducers, were positioned center court for the presentations.

Following the opening remarks by Mr. Makhoul, Melvin Riddick introduced **Anthony Ross**, Class of 2000. Anthony is Dieruff's Boy's Basketball all-time leading scorer with 1,419 career points. He was selected as the Morning Call's Player of the Year in 2000. Anthony was also a force on the Dieruff Football Team, where he played Quarterback. He re-




ceived Dieruff's Male Senior Athlete of the year award in 2000. Anthony continued his playing career at Lackawanna Junior College, and East Stroudsburg.

Linda Cruttenden then took the microphone, and introduced **Debbie O'Brien**, Class of 1977. Debbie played on Dieruff's back-to-back PIAA Girls State Championship Basketball Teams in 1975 and '76, She scored 1,195 points as a Husky. Debbie also played on the 1975 and '77 District XI Volleyball Championship Teams. She received Dieruff's Outstanding Female Senior Athlete Award in 1977. Debbie was inducted into the Lehigh Valley Basketball Hall of Fame in 1998.


Retired Dieruff Principal Susan Bocian then introduced **John Hughes**, Class of 1961. John was the second winner of the Male Kiska Award in 1961. He had lettered in wrestling and track, and had served as the President of Student Council, as well as the Key Club. John has become the number one supporter of Dieruff Athletics. He was instrumental in establishing the Dieruff Alumni Association in 2011, and has been a driving force in its continued development. The Association has been a staunch supporter of Dieruff Athletics. Over the past 10 years John has become the "unofficial" photographer of Dieruff High School. His photographs have made countless students and families feel loved and supported.

We are anxious for you to submit your nominations for the Dieruff Alumni Wall of Distinction, Class of 2023.





Nominations for 2023 must be received in writing by **May 1, 2023**. A nomination form is provided on the next page of this bulletin.



**Purpose:** To give lasting recognition to graduates of Dieruff High School who have made exceptional contributions in their field, bringing honor to themselves and to Dieruff High School. Furthermore, it is the purpose of the Alumni Wall of Distinction to promote Husky Pride among current students, inspiring them to strive toward future accomplishments.

**Criteria For Nomination:** Nominees eligible for selection must have conducted themselves in such manner to reflect honor upon Deiruff High School, and have qualities of character and standards of conduct that are exemplary. Alumni must have graduated at least ten years prior to their nomination. Non-Dieruff graduates may be considered for "honorary" status on the Alumni Wall of Distinction.

Nominees must meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Demonstrated commitment to and involvement with Dieruff High School and the community at an exceptional level.
- Outstanding, enduring contribution to society by making a difference in the lives of others.
- Outstanding professional contribution or achievement in his/her chosen field or endeavor. Considered categories are listed: (A) Arts (B) Business

  - (G) Government (H) Historian (I) Law/ Criminal Justice (J) Media / Journalism/Writing






