Karen Coleman has always taken great pride in her role as "Kiska Mom". Incredibly, she has served in that capacity for 46 years. During that time, she has been the loving "Mom" to Kiska II, III, IV, and V. It has been during the last eleven years that Karen has



FLASHBACK: Kiska Heritage

Five Huskies have now served as the live mascot for Dieruff High School. All of them have gone on to the "Rainbow Bridge". Kiska I, owned by Athletic Trainer "Doc" Warmkessel, served from 1959 to 1975. Karen Coleman and her husband MSgt Ron Coleman were the "parents" of Kiska II (1976-1981), Kiska III (1981-1997), and Kiska IV (1997-2010). Karen was the "Mom" of Kiska V (2010-2022).



Dieruff Welcomes Kiska VI

Following the sad demise of Kiska V, Karen Coleman, faithful "Kiska Mom", reflected on the idea of adopting a replacement mascot. Certainly, that is a very difficult decision. After several days, Karen determined that *Kiska VI* was not only desirable, acquiring Kiska VI was vital in order to continue the six-decade tradition of a live husky mascot for Louis E. Dieruff High School.

Karen also admitted that the loss of Kiska V had left an ache in her heart, and that void had to be filled.

So Karen reached out to Toni Daniels at *Three Husketeers Rescue*, a local organization that specializes in huskies. Fortunately, Toni boasts a nationwide network, and their efforts located a husky in Texas that matched Karen's desired profile. Arrangements were made to have volunteers transport the four-year-old husky from TX to PA.



The exciting "doggie delivery" was scheduled for Sunday, February 27, 2022 at 10:00AM. With a welcoming committee comprised of a number of faithful Dieruff alumni anxiously waiting on the front porch of Karen's home, Kiska VI and Toni pulled up right in front. Wearing a light jacket to protect her from the frosty February air, Kiska VI walked up the sidewalk with a surprising display of confidence. She bounded up the front steps and proceeded to greet her adoring fans with genuine affection.

She was then escorted inside where she promptly made herself right at home on the living room couch. Indeed, Kiska VI was "home".


