Husky Confirmed as Allentown Fire Chief

The man really knows how to climb the ladder of success.....figuratively and literally. Last month, Efrain "Freddie" Agosto was confirmed as the new Fire Chief in Allentown by the City Council.

Agosto is a Puerto Rico native who grew up in Allentown's Cumberland Gardens public housing complex. After his 1986 graduation from Dieruff High

School, he served three years in the U.S. Army, achieving the rank of Specialist 4. With no specific career goals in mind, he worked in janitorial services, and as a psychiatric aide at the Allentown State Hospital. In 2003, a friend suggested Agosto become a firefighter.

During his 18-year career with the fire department, "Freddie" gained valuable and diversified experience, consistently earning recognition and promotions. He received five unit citations for his work. In August of 2018, he was appointed the department's deputy chief, where he was responsible for the supervision and

evaluation of battalion chiefs, assistant fire chiefs, captains, lieutenants, fire marshals, and firefighters. In addition, he was in charge of all personnel and apparatus assigned to the department.

Now, as Fire Chief, "Freddie" Agosto succeeds Fire Chief Jim Wehr, a fellow Dieruff Alum, who retired February 5th after 27 years with the department. It is interesting to note that City Council member Daryl Hendricks, another Dieruff Husky, is strongly encouraging Agosto to share his story with the children of Allentown so that he might inspire them by his example.

Certainly, Fire Chief Agosto has a remarkable story to tell! We commend him for his hard work, dedication, and achievements, and we wish him continued success.


Across the top of the Home Page, click on "Classmate Profiles", then click on "Search". That opens a page entitled "Classmate Profiles". Press "Search" one more

Give it a try!





James D. Wehr 1987 Fire Chief 2018-2021





Salute to Coach Cathy Piston





We are quite confident that she treasures this memento of that valiant victory, and that it will find a prominent spot on Cathy's wall. Husky Pride!








Dieruff Boys Swim Records Broken by Lance Almond

I suppose we could call it "Almond Joy"! Senior swimmer Lance Almond has earned two slots on the Dieruff Boys Swimming Record Board. First, he has established a new record for the 200 Yard Individual Medley, with a time of 2:06.36, replacing swim phenom Phil Rishel's mark of 2:09.05, set in 2018.

Almond's second record is in the 100 Yard Breaststroke, where he posted a time of 1:04.13. The Dieruff record that he beat was set 45 years ago by Thomas Miklovic, Class of 1976. Lance shaved .67 second off the Miklovic time of 1:04.80. When we informed Tom of the event, he cheerfully responded, "records are made to be broken", and he wished Lance continued success.

Lance Almond has plans to attend Moravian College in the Fall, and expects to continue his involvement in competitive swimming. He intends to study criminal justice.

The Dieuff Alumni Association presented Lance with a framed photo collage in recognition of his achievements.






Dieruff Girls Swim Record Broken by Sharice Rose

Her time of 1:08.01 eclipsed the previous record of 1:08.27 set by Caroline Dwornicka in 2019. Even though Caroline's mark was beaten by a slim .26 second, we should not feel too sorry for her; she still owns four other outstanding records on the Girls Record Board.

Conditions this year were more than "challenging". With COVID-19 restrictions in place, swimmers were obliged to sit in the bleachers, with protective masks, and socially distanced, until their event was called. No spectators were allowed in. In fact, the opposing team was not allowed in. They competed "virtually" from their home pool and times were then compared to determine scoring.

Imagine swimming without the adrenaline provided by the competitor in the adjacent lane! Those awkward circumstances did not handicap Sharice Rose! We look forward to watching her compete in 2022 during her Senior Year.






FLASHBACK: Finizzi "Shoos" Away Bad Speaking Habits


