Swimmers can delight in the number <u>6</u>! That's how many Dieruff Swim Records were smashed by Husky Senior Phillip Rishel.


<u>Two's</u> also have significance for Dieruff fans. In Kiska's Korner, you can read about the pair of pups who have

# Alumni Profile: Linda & Jerry Latchic '74

They follow each other alphabetically in their yearbook; their photos are side by side, yet their lives together didn't fit until they were about to leave Dieruff High School.

As an annual tradition in this Valentines issue of "Alumni Profiles" we choose as our couple Linda and Jerry Latchic, Class of 1974.

Jerry is all about Allentown. Born and raised on Wahneta Street, worked, living and retired all within the City limits of our hometown. Linda Laubach was born across the pond in England, where her father was stationed at an Air Force base near Swindon in Wiltshire. When her fami-Iv moved home to Allentown, they would eventually settle on Hanover Avenue (Linda even worked nearby at Cookies Drug Store).

JERRY: I think we were in kindergarten together, but I didn't know who she was. But by the time we got to junior high, we had a class together and finally met. That was in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

LINDA: We didn't date, or even hang out together. We did know who each other was, though. We went out on our first date when we were juniors at Dieruff.

JERRY: We were at a dance and a buddy of mine was dating a friend of Linda's, so we decided to go out on a double date the following Saturday. We decided to see Butterflies Are Free, staring Goldie Hawn. That day Linda had laryngitis real bad. So we go to the movie and in the plot the male lead (played by Edward Albert) is blind. So a funny thing was happening on our first date...she couldn't talk, I can't hear (Jerry is hearing impaired) and the guy on the screen can't see!

But the budding romance didn't take hold immediately, because to Jerry, school was his first priority.

JERRY: I'm analytical. I enjoy numbers. My favorite subject was algebra. I also really liked physics, especially the teacher Mr. (James) Roark. Funny, I almost flunked typing. I learned enough to get by, but boy was I glad that I took that class, because I couldn't do my job at PPL for all those years if I didn't know how to type.

For Linda, she looked into the healthcare field as a potential career.

LINDA: I was a candy striper in the 9th grade at Cedarbrook and later on at Allentown Hospital. I was even in the Health Career Club, but eventually mean, when you're in high school, I decided against a nursing career. My grades weren't the best and I didn't think I would enjoy nursing after I worked as a candy striper in the hospital. But I still wanted to stav in the medical field. 
