

Wall of Distinction Honoree: Mark S. Smyth, PhD '80

Our introduction to the final distinguished alumnus for 2021 takes us to the majestic beauty of Northern California where this 1980 graduate resides with his family. The Louis E. Dieruff High School Alumni Association is very honored to recognize Mark S. Smyth, PhD, a nationally-acclaimed scientist whose path to a successful career in Chemistry had set its course from Mr. Roy Arlotto's classroom.



Today, as the Executive Director of Process/Development/Manufacturing of Pharmacyclics, a subsidiary of AbbVie, Mark oversees the necessary data to support the IND (Investigational New Drug) applications which show that a drug is worthy of validation. From years of research and analysis, this information is then submitted to gain FDA approval. A recent anti-cancer drug with which he was involved is ibrutinib (Imbruvica) which is used in the treatment of leukemia and some lymphomas.

So proud was our beloved Mr. Arlotto that, in 2020, he had this to say of his former stand-out student: "Mark really is the real thing. Buried in his resume is a reference to an award that his company, Pharmacyclics, received in 2019: The American Chemical Society 'Heroes of Chemistry' Award. This is a BIG thing! Mark and his team were selected from among ALL of the drug and chemical companies!"

Mark responded with these heartfelt words about his favorite teacher and his days at Dieruff: "I have always spoken very highly of Mr. Arlotto. Without his presence in my time at LED (in AP Chemistry and three years with the Stage Crew), I would not be who I am and achieved what I have in my career and outside of it. His style of teaching and his being a decent human being taught me, and so many others, by example, not just words. Between the sports, friendships, National Honor Society, and Choir, it was an amazing time. I have always been proud to say I am a Husky, through and through. Always will be, too."

That says it all. From a high school Chemistry classroom to award-winning pharmaceutical advancement in Silicon Valley, this is how one Dieruff educator influenced the life of a grateful, gifted Husky whose hard work and dedication led to the development of a drug to fight cancer.



With Husky Pride in their hearts, the Girls Volleyball Team won three straight games. The young men were visibly proud of their contribution.
















FLASHBACK: 1966 Seniors Make a Fashion Statement
