

Wall of Distinction Honoree: Andre D. Reed '81

Although the emphasis of our Wall of Distinction program does not focus on athletics, the notable achievements of our next 2021 inductee have soared so high that he undeniably deserves to be recognized as an outstanding Dieruff alumnus. For his unparalleled success on and off the field, the Louis E. Dieruff High School Alumni Association is proud to honor Allentown's native son, Andre D. Reed from the Class of 1981.

Every Lehigh Valley football fan knows Andre's record as #83 with the Buffalo Bills – seven consecutive seasons in the NFL Pro Bowl, four uninterrupted Super Bowls, a key receiver in the Bills' immortalized "Comeback" playoff game against the Houston Oilers on January 3, 1993,



which is considered one of the greatest rallies in the history of all American professional sports. Wow! The list could go on and on.

The crowning glory, of course, arrived in 2014 when Andre was enshrined into the NFL Hall of Fame. In the 100-year span of the National Football League, he is one of only 346 who have received the coveted gold jacket. Not bad for a kid from South Allentown.

On the screen Andre has provided commentaries for ESPN, analyses for Fox, and has appeared in Hawaii Five-0, MacGyver, and Magnum PI television episodes. Movie fans who pay close attention to Cuba Gooding Jr.'s character in the popular 1996 film "Jerry Maguire" will hear him compare his contract negotiation to that of "Andre Reed." Take a listen; it's fun to watch.

Since his retirement, this '81 Husky established the Andre Reed Foundation to help underprivileged youngsters reach their full potential. Serving as an Ambassador for the Boys & Girls Clubs of America, Andre travels the country to promote his "Read with Reed 83 Challenge," a literacy incentive program for children. And, with his full schedule, Andre still makes time to visit his East Side alma mater to encourage young Huskies to find their passion, work hard, and to never, ever give up.

Andre never gave up. His bronze bust in Canton proves that.

Wall of Distinction Honoree: Carmella A. Saraceno '75



My earliest memory of our next Wall of Distinction honoree is that she was always in the Dieruff Art Room or on her way to it. After classes ended for the day, she would stop at home for a snack and then return to the school to complete a special art project late into the evening. It is no surprise that this hard-working, multitalented Husky, who was hand-picked during her junior year to attend the prestigious Governor's School for the Arts, became an accomplished artist/sculptor, teacher, creative entrepreneur, and writer. The Louis E. Dieruff High School Alumni Association is proud to introduce our hometown Husky from the Class of 1975, Carmella A. Saraceno.

Carmella went on to earn her BFA from the Tyler School of Art at Temple University during which time she also studied in Rome. After earning a living in New York City in the '80s, Carmella took her work ethic westward to the galleries and studios of Chicago, where she and her husband reside today. She has also been an instructor, advisor, and the Director of International Affairs at The School of the Art Institute of Chicago.

In 1990, Carmella founded Methods & Materials, Inc., a unique specialty service which provides rigging, relocation, and installation of fine art and the careful handling of rare artifacts. In addition to her writing and artwork, which has been exhibited both nationally and internationally, she functions today as the business's co-owner and Chief Financial Officer. She says of her company's work, "Art is vital to a civil society. The services we provide within our society have truly been a great honor and privilege to orchestrate."

Known for her warmth, benevolence, and storytelling, Carmella delightfully told me that her cheeks hurt from smiling so much upon receiving the news that she had been selected for the Dieruff Alumni Wall of Distinction. Her reaction was heartwarming, and her gratitude and enthusiasm were palpable. How appropriate it will be to see our tribute to her success permanently displayed on the wall around the corner from the same Dieruff Art Room in which her young talent got its start.

That made me smile, too, which stamped another memory of Carmella Saraceno.







FLASHBACK: 1988 Ledannus Makes Accurate Forecast



Predictably, Tom did pursue a career in the armed services. Recently, he was promoted to the rank of Rear Admiral in the United States Navy, and is now serving as the








